Professor Luis Hinojosa holds the Chair of International Law and International Relations of Granada University where he was Director of the Department of Public International Law (2009-2017) and former Director of the European Documentation Centre (1999-2009). He is also member of the Board of ESIL (European Society of International Law) (2012-2020) and has been his President between 2017 and 2019. After working as an attorney in Brussels (Van Bael and Bellis law firm), he joined Granada University teaching staff. His main areas of teaching and research include international economic law, European Union law, and international terrorism.

His research has covered a number of different fields in international and European law. He has published extensively on the regulation of the European Single Market, above all on the free movement of capital and the integration of European financial markets. He has dealt with the application of European law by national judges, European and international tax law, EU competencies and EU external economic relations. Within the context of international law, he has analyzed the legal and economic aspects of international terrorism, and their implications for human rights, as well as published on the concepts of sovereignty and globalization, transparency of international economic institutions, the economic analysis of law and various issues of international economic law. He has written/edited books on the international markets regulation and the erosion of the European social and political model (2019), the European Banking Union (2015), international economic law (2010), international legal instruments against the financing of terrorism (2008), the competencies of the European Union (2006), fair trade and social rights (2002) and the international and European regulation of capital movements (1997).

Professor Hinojosa is a member of the Editorial Board of the *European Journal of International Law* and of the Advisory Board of the *Revista de Derecho Comunitario Europeo*, member of the Executive Board of AEDEUR (Spanish Association for the Study of European Law), and member of AEPDIRI (Spanish Association for International Law), and former member of its Executive Board. He served between 2008-2011 as Coordinator of Social and Legal Sciences of AGAE (Andalusian Agency of Evaluation), the independent scientific body in charge of the evaluation of research of the 10 Andalusian universities.

Professor Hinojosa has given conferences or taught courses in Spanish, French and English in Universities and Institutions in the USA, Latin America, North Africa, Europe and Asia. He has been Visiting Scholar in the Stetson School of Law, Florida (2007) and in Berkeley University, California (2010).
